
Anglo Australian adds mineralisation at Mandilla South

Anglo Australian Resources, which has Kalgoorlie-Boulder mining identity John Jones as its chairman, has found more mineralisation at its Mandilla gold project east of Kambalda.

The company's ASX statement

on Monday said further analysis of a recent aircore drilling campaign had revealed an extra 500m of mineralisation at Mandilla South.

"(T)he Mandilla South weathered bedrock target now extends along the NW-SE strike for more than 1.5km and with a width of typically 100m, with gold values

exceeding 1g/tonne recorded in most of the holes along the trend," the company said.

"The gold values returned indicate a likely supergene-enriched gold zone at a vertical depth of from 40m-50m. Anglo Australian considers Mandilla South to be a high-priority target for further

exploration. "Infill aircore lines on 160m-spaced centres are planned to better define the anomaly, to seek higher grade or thicker zones of mineralisation, and better position any future bedrock drilling program."

The aircore drilling program involved some 28 holes along three

400m-spaced traverses for an aggregate 1525m, with an average depth of about 55m a hole.

Anglo Australian mined 23,000oz of gold from an open-cut palaeochannel at Mandilla in 2006-07.

Anglo Australian shares were up 0.1¢, or 1.3 per cent, at 7.7¢ yesterday.
